
Batting Filled Tube Ideas



Batting -Filled Fabric Tubes

Cut Fabric Strip Sizes for:

1", 11/4" and 11/2" Blue Tubes

For 1" —— 4" wide by 45" to 90" long

For 11/4" — 5" wide by 45" to 90" long

For $1\frac{1}{2}$ " — 6" wide by 45" to 90" long

Cut 3 to 4 oz. batting same width and length as fabric strip. Bow—Cut fabric strip same width as above, except 30" long.

Instructions: Use 1/4" seam allowances.

Fold strip lengthwise, right sides together. Sew down length of tube. Follow instructions on front of this sheet for turning and filling tube at the same time. Safety pin ends of filled tubes together to a padded surface, such as ironing board. (#1)

Twist or braids tube loosely. Safety pin ends to hold. Turn in raw ends, hand or machine sew across ends. With right sides together, follow illustration (#2) for making bow. Sew across ends and down long side,

leave open in center to turn. Insert blue tube into center opening. Use dowel turning method to turn each end of bow out through center opening. Press bow. Fold into bow and secure center. Make 2 bows for garland, securing one at each end of garland. Sew a 1/2" plastic ring behind each bow to hang garland.

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
